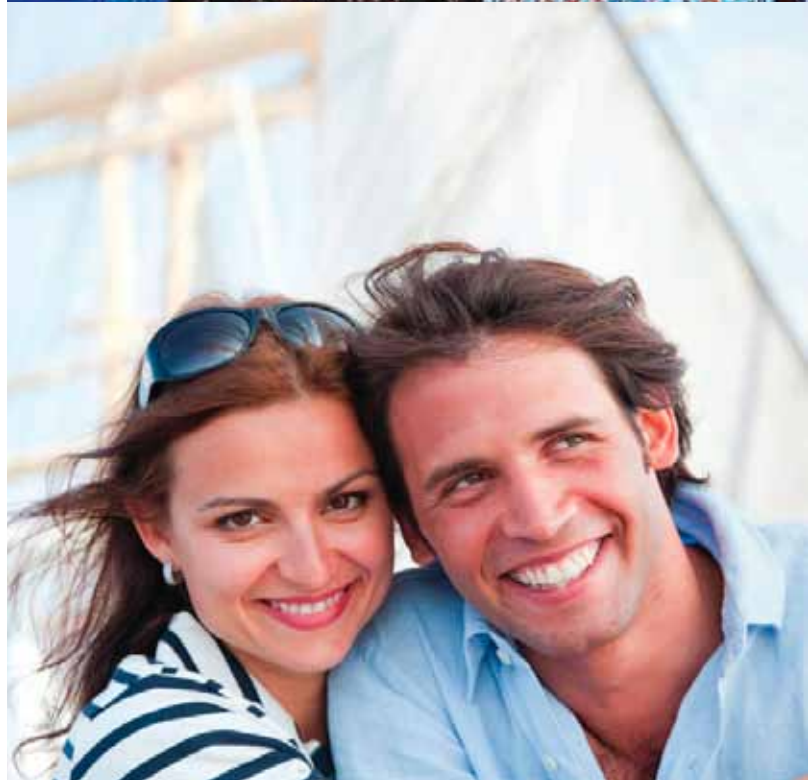

DAILY ITINERARY

Monday, April 16

DEPART U.S.

Depart the U.S. on your overnight flight to Lisbon, Portugal.

Tuesday, April 17

ARRIVE LISBON, TRANSFER TO HOTEL

Arrive in Lisbon, where you will be escorted by private coach to your centrally-located hotel. The remainder of the day is at your leisure.

Wednesday, April 18

BOARD STAR FLYER, WELCOME DINNER

Enjoy this morning at leisure. Later today, transfer to the port to board the *Star Flyer*. Board the ship and settle into your cabin before gathering for the Captain's Reception and Welcome Dinner. WD

Thursday, April 19

AT SEA

On this first day at sea you will have a chance to relax after your trip, to enjoy the *Star Flyer's* ambience and amenities, and meet some of your fellow passengers. Today, and on Sunday and next Wednesday, you'll have time to explore this modern clipper ship that combines the romance of sailing ships with contemporary comforts and amenities. Winds permitting, you might climb (with a safety harness!) to the crow's nest for a panoramic view of the coast and the sea. Enjoy the pools, the Belle Époque library, the spa and the convivial Piano Bar. B/L/D

Friday, April 20

TANGIER, MOROCCO

Tangier was the model for the setting of the film *Casablanca*. It retains its faded charm, as an intriguing mix of Moroccan, European and African influences. The beach itself is one of the highlights, with or without the camel rides. Among its string of bars and restaurants is The Sun Beach, where Tennessee Williams drafted *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof*.

Within the city you can explore the Grand Socco, which is the main market square, the storied Petit Socco, the Medina and the verdant Mendoubia Gardens. The Musée d'Art Contemporain, near the Grand Socco, is devoted to contemporary Moroccan Art.

Tonight your ship sails through the Straits of Gibraltar into the Mediterranean, en route to Motril, Spain. B/L/D
Saturday, April 21

MOTRIL, SPAIN

Disembark in the Andalusian town of Motril, between the sea and the Sierra Lujar Mountains. Motril is both a commercial fishing port and a thriving resort town, with two beaches and a coastline of coves, inlets and cliffs. Explore the city during the day or join an optional excursion to Granada, less than an hour away, to visit the fabulous Alhambra.* The well-restored palaces within this hilltop fortress, and the Generalife Gardens, embody chapters in Spain's history from the later Moorish rulers to the reign of the Holy Roman Emperor Charles V. Tour the Alhambra and the Generalife; then return to Motril and board the *Star Flyer*. B/L/D

Sunday, April 22

AT SEA

During the first part of this day at sea the ship follows the coast of Spain, sailing toward the Balearic Islands. As you will have discovered, the ship offers activities—scavenger hunts, contests, knot-tying class, sing-alongs—and the captain shares tales of ships and sailing as he gives the morning briefing. B/L/D

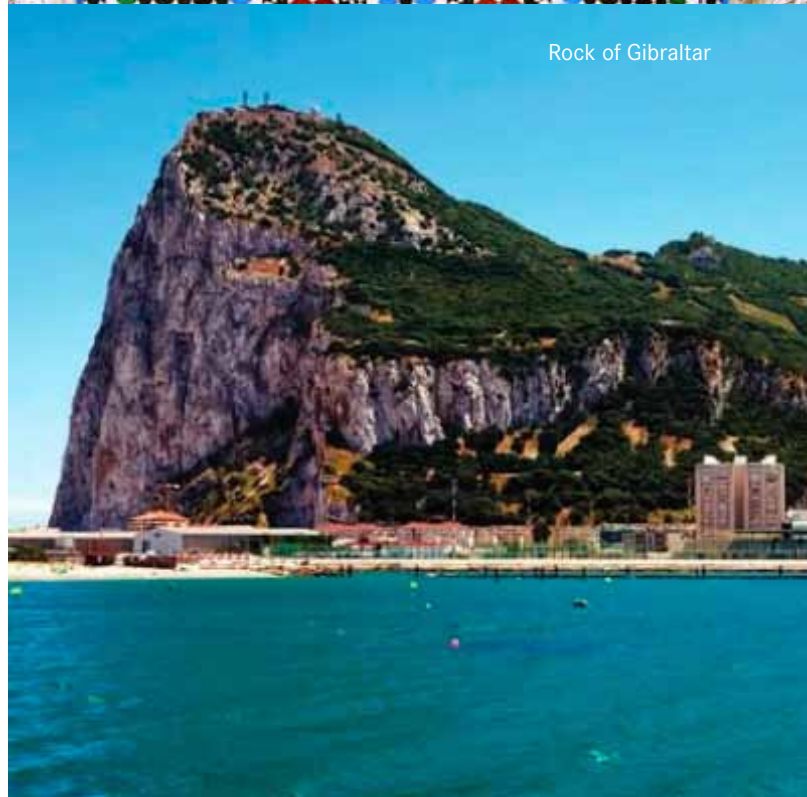
Monday, April 23

PALMA, MALLORCA (BALEARIC ISLANDS)

Today you call at Palma, the major port of the Balearic island of Mallorca. Palma, now famed as a resort area, has a long and tumultuous history under Roman, Moorish and Spanish rulers. Like Barcelona and the rest of Catalonia, these islands are part of Spain but distinctive in language and heritage. The ancient center of Palma, a compact and walkable area, includes the towering Gothic cathedral, built over the remains of a mosque that in turn covered a Roman temple. Its vast open nave and soaring Gothic columns have been added over the centuries, with touches more recently by Antonio Gaudí. Behind the cathedral, a maze of winding streets leads to shops and open-air markets. B/L/D

Tuesday, April 24

MAHON, MENORCA (BALEARIC ISLANDS)

Call at Mahón, Menorca, one of the world’s finest natural deep harbors. Lord Nerlson chose it as the base for the British Mediterranean fleet during the Napoleonic Wars. Spend some time in the central Placa de S’Esplanada enjoying the fountains, the gardens and the passing scene. Walk along Carrer d’Isabel II past elegant Georgian buildings for a splendid view of the harbor. Not far away are neighborhoods of traditional whitewashed houses, and the one remaining piece of the old city wall. You may explore the island further if you wish, before returning to the ship for dinner. B/L/D

Wednesday, April 25

AT SEA

Today is your one remaining day at sea, to be used for whatever aspects of a sailing ship call to you. It may be the day to climb to the crow’s nest, visit the Bridge, arrange for a spa treatment, or all of these. Crew members are happy to demonstrate how to splice a line, tie a proper knot, or reef a sail. Enjoy the day as you sail southeastward toward the North African coast. B/L/D

Thursday, April 26

TUNIS, TUNISIA

Disembark in Tunis, the Tunisian capital. Here you may visit the Medina and its markets, with their enticing displays of produce, fish, spices and goods of all kinds. Walk the boulevards that the French added to the city, bordered by buildings in Art Nouveau style. If you are able to visit the Bardo Museum, you will be rewarded with a stunning collection of well-preserved Roman mosaics that vividly bring the ancient world to life. B/L/D

Friday, April 27

PANTELLERIA, SICILY

Pantelleria, a volcanic island west of Sicily, lies only 35 miles from the African coast. It is an island of marine grottoes, hot springs and even a natural sauna. Among its mysteries

are Neolithic funeral mounds called sesi, which dot the hills. Strongly influenced by nearby North African cultures, the people of this island built the distinctive traditional domed houses called dammisi with features borrowed from the Maghreb. If you can visit the national park called La Montagna Grande, you will have clear views of the surrounding sea and perhaps of the African coast. B/L/D

Saturday, April 28

VALLETTA, MALTA

Grateful that the Knights of St. John withstood a huge Turkish invasion of Malta in 1565, European rulers gave them funds with which they built this city. Thousands of years earlier, before 3500 B.C., Neolithic peoples built temples at Hagar Qim, the remnants of which are considered to be the oldest human structures on earth.

Disembark the *Star Flyer* after breakfast in Valletta.* Your luggage will be transferred to your hotel. Enjoy a walking tour through the city on the way to Barracca Gardens, where you’ll have a panoramic view of the Grand Harbour. Visit St. John’s Co-Cathedral, an opulent baroque monument built for the Knights. The Grand Master’s Palace, now the seat of the Maltese government, may be visited when Parliament is not in session. In its Council Chamber are renowned Gobelin tapestries, and other halls boast outstanding frescoes.

Stop at the 16th-century fort, St. James Cavalier, which is now an arts complex. After lunch you will have time for your choice of activities, whether that be visiting more of the city’s historic buildings, exploring the shops, or taking a short bus or taxi ride to the old capital, Medina, known as the Silent City. Have dinner on your own in your choice of Valletta’s restaurants. B/L

Transfer to Malta International Airport for the first leg of your flight home. B

NOTE: In the event of unsatisfactory weather or wind conditions, *Star Flyer* reserves the right to proceed under motor power in order to meet itinerary requirements.

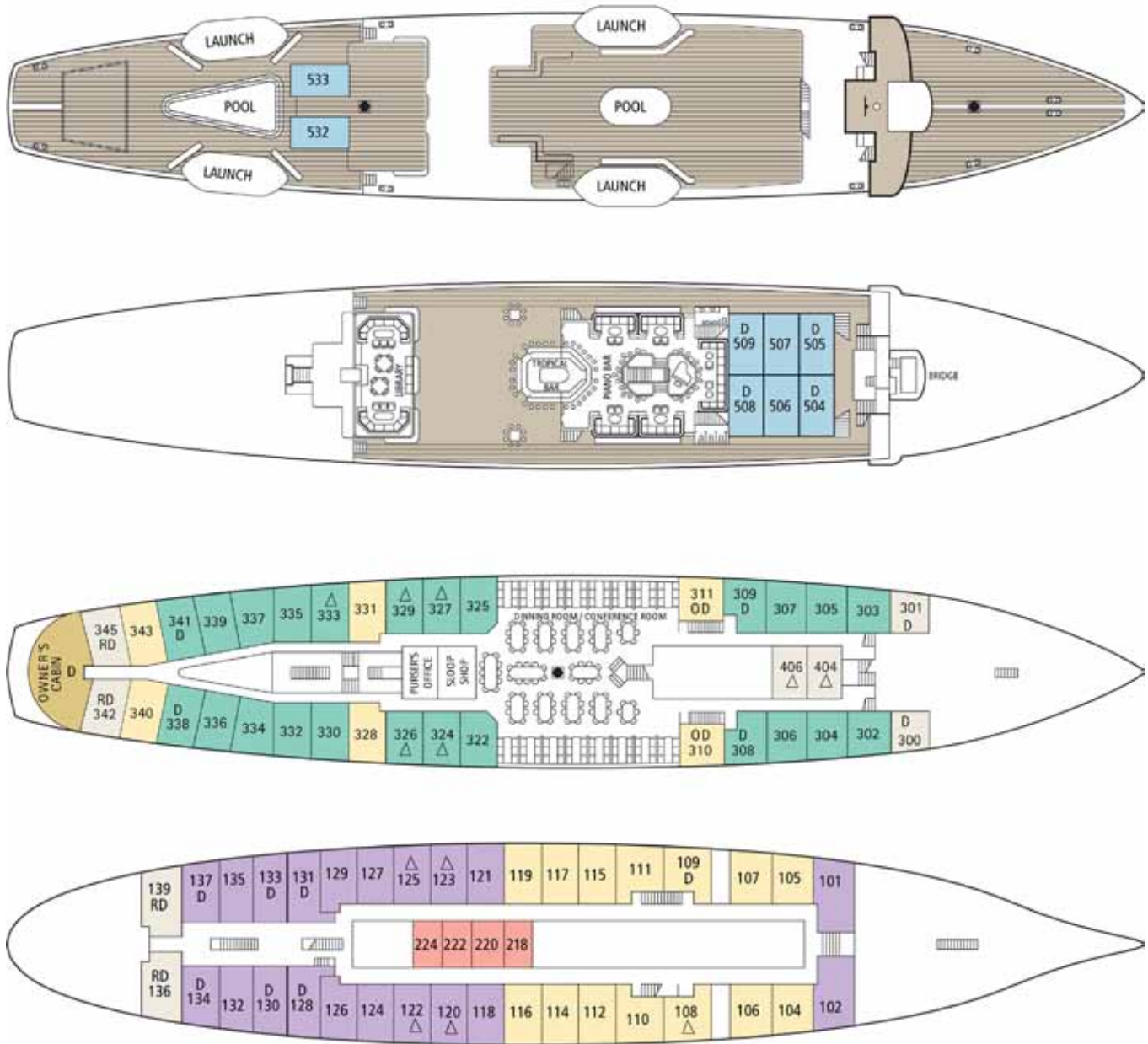
